Evening Duty: Assignment on Floor & First Aid Station

{All Volunteer Nurses required to register and submit membership dues; and meet at HP Station 30 min prior to evening service for group prayer and assignments}

Nurses are assigned to areas in sanctuary during service to: assess for safety issues; prevention of accidents and injuries; assist the pulpit ministers; assist altar workers, respond to emergencies and prepare incident reports; assist parents with small children; assist elderly, handicapped or special needs members as directed; and assist members in the congregation as a need is identified.

Uniform Dress Code: Women - long sleeve white uniform dress or white jacket and blouse/ white skirt at least knee length with white stockings; and clean white uniform shoes. Small stud earrings, okay. Watch with second hand recommended. Men - black pants with white shirt and white jacket (lab coat) with black shoes or clean white tennis shoes if preferred.
